#### A. Slant

The slant of the writing is defined by the angel of inclination and direction of the letter and angel formed between the letter down stroke of the baseline. The slant tells about the emotions, degree of sentiments control, emotional control of the writer, there four types of slant:



- *Rightward Slant:* The slant could be forward if the words leaning towards the right.
- *Leftward Slant:* The slant could be backward if the words leaning towards left.
- Vertical Slant: The slant could be straight.
- *Variable Slant:* The slant could be forward and backward slants in adjoining letters.

## C. Size

The size of the handwriting, a benchmark of average writing is 1/16 to 3/16 of an inch high. Anything 3/16 of an inch or over would be considered larger than normal; anything under 1/16 of an inch is considered as a smaller. Larger writing can be portraying someone who is superior, takes pride, outgoing and extroverted, arrogant, boastful or they put on an act of confidence. Small handwriting can mean people who are respectful, tolerable, introvert, shy, deep thinker or an academic.



## D. Zones

The handwriting is partitioned in three zones called *upper*, *middle* and *lower zone*. The personality can be identified by analyzing three zones, the section of three zones are used to be defines the balance between the three major areas of ego development of the writer, the intellectual and spiritual sphere of the individual everyday activities and the unconscious initiative drives.

- *Upper zone* reveals future, upper body, philosophical interest spiritual, intellectual, goals, plans, mental perception.
- Middle zone reveals present, middle body, thinking process, tendencies of argue, environment, interaction among people.
- *Lower zone* reveals past, lower body, physical life, sources of energy, material item, memory, drives.

E. Baseline



Handwriting reveals a lot of accurate information about the writer. Baseline is ones handwriting in the line along which writing flows. The three most common baseline found in any handwriting are ascending, descending and straight. Base line is used to find the emotion outlay and nature of the writer. Ascending baseline represents the person is optimistic, hopefulness and cheerfulness, stay busy moreover active,



excitability, choleric behavior, descending baseline shows that the person is pessimistic, mental tiredness of a temporary nature and has digestive trouble. Straight baseline shows that the person has stable outward behavior, straightness, realism, perfection and disciplined.

## F. Word Spacing

Spacing between the words is indicated by observing the width of one letter in handwriting; it represents the distance that the writer would like to maintain between himself and other people. Spacing tells the closeness of writer with the other people and his intelligence. Wide spacing shows discrimination, independence, good taste, exclusiveness, pride, has clear thoughts, ability to organize the work. Narrow spacing shows in ability to be alone, poor taste, friendliness, unstable in emotion or thinking.
